

## **Yves Bertoncini** **Director of the Jacques Delors Institute**

Yves Bertoncini was born on 30 March 1970 in Chambéry (Savoie). He is married and is the father of three children.

He has been Director of the Jacques Delors Institute since April 2011. He assists the President in his activities, directs the team and is responsible for administrative and financial management, as well as the implementation of its work programme. He also takes part in the Jacques Delors Institute's analytical works and productions, focusing in particular on questions of European politics and institutions, and on issues relating to democracy, citizenship and mobility.

Yves Bertoncini is an administrator at the European Commission, where he has worked at the Directorates-General of "Education, Training, Youth" and "Regional Policy" between 1998 and 2001.

Previously, he also worked in the office of the French Prime Minister as head of the "Europe" mission at the *Centre d'Analyse Stratégique* (2006-09), and as adviser to the Secretary-General of European Affairs (2010- 2011). He has also worked for the French Ministry of Foreign and European Affairs, the French embassy in Algiers (1992-93) and for the organisation of the "National Dialogue for Europe" (1995-1997). He also worked as director of international affairs at the *Fédération Française des Sociétés d'Assurance* (2002-05) and as director of the strategy and studies of the *Conseil de Coopération Economique*.

Yves Bertoncini teaches European issues at the *Corps des Mines* (Mines ParisTech) and at the College of Europe in Bruges. He has also taught at the Paris Institute of Political Studies (2001-2011) and the *Ecole Nationale d'Administration* (2007-09).

He is the author of numerous "policy papers," tribunes, and other works on European issues (division of powers, democracy, European Parliament, etc.), including "Europe : le temps des fils fondateurs" (Michalon, 2005), "Politique européenne - Etats, pouvoirs et citoyens de l'UE" (Sciences - Po/Dalloz, 2010), and "Reforming Europe's Governance" (Jacques Delors Institute, 2014).

Yves Bertoncini is a member of the Steering Committee of the *Cycle des Hautes Etudes Européennes* (CHEE), the Scientific Committee of Flash Eurobarometer (TNS/Kantar), *Mouvement Européen-France*, and was a member of the Franco-German Youth Office (OFAJ) advisory board (2012-2015).

He holds degrees from Sciences Po Grenoble and the College of Europe in Bruges. He has also studied at Sciences Po Paris and at the University of California in Berkeley. He participated in the "Young Leaders Program" of the Ernst Dräger Stiftung and the American Council on Germany.
